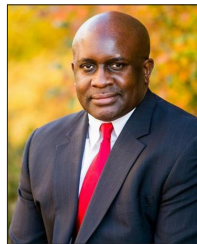

Gunnar Lovhoiden is a Professor of Engineering at Andrews University. He has taught classes at Andrews University from 1995-1999, 2003-2005, and from 2008 to present. His research focus is biomedical imaging using near infrared light. He cofounded Luminetx Inc, to

commercialize the Veinviewer™ prototype he designed and constructed as a part of his PhD requirements.



Frank Tuitt is the Senior Advisor to the Chancellor and Provost on Diversity and Inclusion at the University of Denver and Professor of Higher Education in the Morgridge College of Education. His research explores topics related to access and equity in higher education; teaching and learning

in racially diverse college classrooms; and diversity and organizational transformation.



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
